

2023 Year in Review

2023 has been a busy and productive year with many milestones:


- The Board added 3 new members: Sally Shaw, Leslie Harris and Barbara Speer.
- Our Development Director, Leslie Harris, submitted a Hogg Foundation grant and is spearheading our first fundraiser on March 2.
- Wellspring began work with a strategic planning consultant. That work continues in 2024.
- Wellspring established a relationship with Family Promise Grayson County and continues to support LifePath Systems, Journey of Hope and Family Promise Collin County.
- Wellspring began exploring collaborations with FUMC Allen and Grace UMC in Sherman.
- Wellspring applied for and received a grant from the North Texas Conference to film 3 videos on a mental health topic. The first one, by counselor Angela Moore on grief, is on the Wellspring website. It also was sent to the North Texas Conference, First UMC Plano, and Grace UMC Sherman. The other two will be completed in early 2024.
- Wellspring provided 2 grief support seminars and a divorce recovery seminar at no cost to FUMC Plano or the participants.
- With Rev. Judith Reedy, Dr. Carolyn Maurer and Angela Moore developed and offered programming following the Allen Outlet Mall shooting and the arson at the Unitarian Church.
- New part-time staff were added: a bookkeeper and social media director.

Counseling Hours Rise Slightly from 2022

The number of counseling hours provided by Wellspring declined from 2020 to 2022, but rose slightly in 2023. We are engaging in a purposeful effort to increase the number of clients and counseling hours in 2024.



In 2024, we are hopeful that the March fundraiser and grants will add significant additional income.





Expense Analysis

Counselor payroll is 55% of total expenses.

63% of Wellspring client fees are \$55 or less. Fully licensed counselors are paid \$60/hour.

Other staff payroll is 25% of total expenses.
